Rib & Seed Stitch Scarf

This scarf is made of 3x3 rib on each end and seed stitch in the body. The seed stitch gives it a rich texture. Slipping the first stitch of each row gives it a nice edge and prevents it from stretching out of shape.

Skill Level



EASY

Materials



MEDIUM

or



BULKY

2 skeins worsted or bulky yarn

Size 8 needles for worsted weight yarn or size 11 for bulky yarn

Gauge

Gauge is not important

Notes

These directions produce a scarf that is approximately 5½” wide with the bulky yarn. For a wider scarf, cast on an additional 6 or 12 stitches.

Directions

Beginning Ribbing

CO 33 stitches using the knitted cast on

Row 1: K3, [P3, K3] across

Row 2: Sl st, P2, [K3, P3] across

Row 3: Sl st, K2, [P3, K3] across

Rows 4-14: Repeat rows 2 & 3

Row 15: Sl st, K2tog across (17 sts)

Body

Row 16: Sl st, [K, P] across, ending with K

Repeat row 16 until the scarf measures 52”

Ending Fringe

Row 1: Sl st, *[K, YO, K] in same stitch, K* repeat from * to * across (33 sts)

Row 2: Sl st, P2, [K3, P3] across

Row 3: Sl st, K2, [P3, K3] across

Rows 4-14: Repeat rows 2 & 3

Row 15: K3, [P3, K3] across

BO using the “Two Stitches Forward & One Stitch Back” bind off

Sew in ends



Two Stitches Forward and One Stitch Back Bind Off

This bind-off is a near perfect match to the knitted cast on.

1. Leave a tail on your project about 3 times the length of the bind off edge, and thread it in a blunt sewing needle.
2. **Two Stitches Forward...** Insert the sewing needle into the 1st two stitches on your knitting needle as *if to purl* and pull through, leaving the stitches on the needle.
3. **One Stitch Back...** Insert the sewing needle back into the 1st stitch as *if to knit* and pull through. Drop that stitch off the knitting needle.
4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 until you get to the end.
